
DHS Rental Assistance: Eligibility

Source	Criteria *	Use
PA Human Services Block Grant (Homeless Assistance Program)	 homeless or near homeless at/or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level able to sustain the rent moving forward 	 can only be used by a household once every two years Max amount: \$1000
PA Child Welfare (Needs-Based Budget)	 must have at least one minor child homeless or at-risk of homelessness able to sustain the rent moving forward 	 can only be used by a household once every two years Max amount: \$1500
Urban Redevelopment Authority Housing Opportunity Fund (Housing Stabilization Program)	 within City of Pittsburgh homeless or near homeless at or below 50% of the Area Median Income (AMI) 	 can only be used by a household once every five years can assist with up to six months of arrears and/or a maximum of \$3,000 can support a household prior to entering eviction proceedings
American Rescue Plan Act	 unable to pay rent have an income at or below 80% of AMI must have written or oral lease must demonstrate COVID-19 financial impact 	Maximum assistance is 10 months or \$10,000, whichever comes first

Overall ERAP Spend











Allegheny County COVID Rental Assistance 2.0

Definitions

- <u>HMIS</u>: locally administered data system used to record and analyze client, service and housing data for individuals and families who are homeless or at risk of homelessness.
- <u>Coordinated Entry</u>: operated by DHS; provides a coordinated intake and assessment process for the CoC, enabling those experiencing homelessness within Allegheny County's geographical region to be connected to the services they need in a consumer-centered manner
